



Pioneer Scholar (deceased) in the Islamic Studies

Ayatollah Ebrahim Amini



Biography

Ayatollah Ebrahim Amini was born in 1925 in Najafabad, Isfahan. He lost his father at age six. He was interested in studying religious sciences from his childhood and went to the Qom seminary in March 1942. Due to the conditions of Iran at that time (the Invasion of Iran by the Allies), he was forced to go to Isfahan to continue his seminary education and study religious sciences. He re-entered Qom in 1947 to complete seminary courses and benefited from the presence of many scholars, including Grand Ayatollah Borujerdi, Grand Ayatollah Golpaygani, Grand Ayatollah Mar'ashi Najafi, Grand Ayatollah Allameh Tabataba'i and Grand Ayatollah Imam Khomeini in jurisprudence, Usul (Principles of Islamic Jurisprudence), wisdom and ethics. During this period, he did not neglect to teach the lessons learned.

The late Ayatollah Amini, who was one of the fighters before the revolution, together with his like-minded people, formed an organization in Qom in 1962, which later formed the central core of the Qom seminary scholar's community. After the victory of the Islamic Revolution, he was active as one of the effective members of this organization. Member of the Board of Trustees of the Universal Association of Islamic Sciences, Board of Trustees of Imam Sadiq (AS) University, three rounds of membership of the Assembly of Experts for leadership and its deputy, Chairman of the Secretariat Assembly of Experts for leadership, Ahl al-Bayt World Assembly, Expediency Discernment Council, Constitutional referendum and Qom's Friday Prayer Imam were of his other scientific and executive experiences. As a representative of the Islamic Republic of Iran and seminaries in international conferences, he has repeatedly given speeches and presented scholarly and jurisprudential opinions.

In addition to teaching at Qom seminary, Ayatollah Amini has valuable books, especially in the field of Islamic education, including "The Codes of Training"; "Islam, Education and Training"; "Training"; "Self-Building"; "Religious Education, Primary and Secondary Education"; "Exemplary Lady of Islam Fatemeh Zahra (PBUH)"; "What Everyone Should Know about Islam"; "Patterns of Virtue"; "Jihad with the Nafs (Self)"; "Economic Discipline, Islam's View on the Acquisition and Consumption of Property"; "Imamate and the Imams"; "Revelation in the Heavenly Religion"; "Knowing God"; "Prophethood and Prophet of Islam"; "Resurrection in Quran"; "Introduction to Islam"; "The Children Book on Islam (4 volumes)"; "Justice of the World"; "An Introduction to the Right and Duties of Women in Islam"; "Principles of Marriage Family Ethics"; "Ethical and Social Discourses".

Ayatollah Amini died in April 2020 at the age of 94, in Qom.
