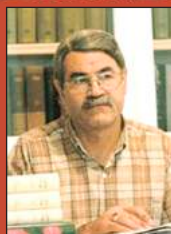

Dr. Manouchehr Sanei Dare Bidi



Biography

Dr. Manouchehr Sanei Dare Bidi was born in 1946 in Isfahan. He received his bachelor's degree from the University of Tehran in 1975 and in 1977, received his master's degree in philosophy from the same university. In 1992, he defended his doctoral dissertation at the University of Tehran and then became a faculty member of the Department of Philosophy of Shahid Beheshti University. Dr. Sanei has been teaching, researching, translating, and educating students in the field of Western philosophy for the past thirty years. With his high scientific accuracy in choosing the appropriate words in translating the opinions of the world's leading thinkers, he has made great efforts to enrich philosophical content and facilitate the access of researchers and the scientific community of the country to this content. Professor Sanei has translated numerous works on the thought of Western philosophers, including Leibniz, Kant, Descartes, Nietzsche, and Dilthey, and presented them to the scientific community.

He has published numerous books including the translation of important works by Kant, including 'Metaphysical foundations of the Doctrine of virtue (Philosophy of Virtue)', 'Lessons of Philosophical Ethics', 'Religion within the Bounds of Bare Reason', and also, the works of Wilhelm Deltay, including 'The Organization of the Historical World in the Humanities', 'An Introduction to the Humanities', 'Historical Understanding and Hermeneutics', 'Understanding the Human World', 'Experience and Poetry' and numerous works in the field of Western philosophy including 'Friedrich Schleiermacher', 'History of Aesthetics' and 'Philosophy Lexicon'. Also, the "Encyclopedia of Aesthetics" translated by Dr. Sanei Dare Bidi and a group of translators was selected for the 24th Book of the Year Award of the Islamic Republic of Iran.

He published other books as an author including 'Leibniz's Philosophy', 'Philosophy of Ethics and Principles of Behavior', 'Nietzsche's Message', 'The Place of Man in Kant's Thought' and 'Principles of Philosophical Thought (General Philosophy).
