Anna Maria Krasnowolska

Professor Anna Maria Krasnowolska, born in Jan. 19, 1949 in Cracow, Poland; He studied Iranian philology at Jagiellonian University, Cracow, 1967-72; and in 1983 defended his doctoral dissertation. Working at the Institute of Oriental Studies, Dept. of Iranian Studies of the same University since 1972, at present she is there as professor, director of the Institute of Oriental Studies J.U. 1999-2002; and head of the Dept. of Iranian Studies 2000-2017. In addition to numerous research papers, she carries out research in the area of Persian literature and culture of the Iranian world as well as Shahnameh and Iranian mythology and history, and described his views on Ferdowsi's Shahnameh. He supervises the publication of the Polish translation of Shahnameh. So far, the first volume of this translation, which is prose, is published and other volumes are in the publication. She is the Member of Societas Iranologica Europaea (board member 2003-2011); member of the Oriental Committee of Polish Academy of Sciences; and member of editorial board member of Folia Orientalia journal. In addition to receiving research scholarship at the Ferdowsi University of Mashhad 1978-79; 3-Krasnowolska has been awarded the scholarship of the Swedish Institute and Uppsala University 1994. Among other projects, writing "Historia Iranu" (2010) and editor of the volume Irańskie drogi do nowoczesności, Manifesty (2014) are of her activities. Her Translations from Persian include Ferdowsi's Księga Królewska (The Book of Kings) and Shahrnush Parsipur's Tuba i znaczenie nocy (Touba and the Meaning of Night) and Lives in Kraków too.
